Aviv is the 1st Biblical Month and the 7th Talmudic

The name Aviv appears in the pre-Babylonian exile writings; while in the post-exile writings it appears as Nisan.

“This month shall be to you the beginning of months. It shall be the first month of the year to you.” Exodus 12:2

“Observe the month of Aviv and keep Pesach to יהוה [Yehovah] your God; for in the month of Aviv, יהוה your God took you out of Mitzrayim by night.” Deuteronomy 16:1

“In the first month, which is the month Nisan, in the twelfth year of king Achashverosh, they cast Pur, that is, the lot, before Haman from day to day, and from month to month, to the twelfth month, which is the month Adar.” Esther 3:7



Yeshua's Last Seder

Yeshua's last Passover seder with His talmidim was most likely on a Wednesday, the night before the Passover of the Judeans. He was crucified the next day and placed in the grave right before the sundown and the beginning of the Judeans' Passover. Then He was resurrected on Sunday right before dawn, fulfilling the Messianic sign of three days and three nights in the grave.

“When the hour had come, He sat down with the twelve sh'luchim. He said to them, 'I have earnestly desired to eat this Pesach with you before I suffer, for I tell you, I will no longer by any means eat of it until it is fulfilled in the Kingdom of God.' He received a cup, and when He had given thanks, He said, 'Take this, and share it among yourselves, for I tell you, I will not drink at all again from the fruit of the vine, until the Kingdom of God comes.' He took bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it, and gave to them, saying, 'This is My body which is given for you. Do this in memory of Me.' Likewise, He took the cup after supper, saying, 'This cup is the new covenant in My blood, which is poured out for you.'” Luke 22:14-20

“Now it was the Preparation Day of the Pesach [Thursday morning], at about the sixth hour, Pilate said to the Yehudim, “Behold, your King!” They cried out, “Away with Him! Away with Him! Crucify Him!” Pilate said to them, “Shall I crucify your King?” The chief Kohanim answered, “We have no king but Caesar!” So then he delivered Him to them to be crucified.

So they took Yeshua and led Him away. He went out, bearing His cross, to the place called “The Place of a Skull,” which is called in Hebrew, “Gulgolta,” where they crucified Him, and with Him two others, one on either side, and Yeshua in the middle. Pilate wrote a title and put it on top of the cross. There was written, “Yeshua haNotzri Melech haYehudim” YESHUA OF NATZERET, KING OF THE YEHUDIM.” John 19:14-19

“When the Shabbat was past [Saturday evening], Miryam from Magdala, and Miryam the mother of Ya'akov, and Shalomit, bought spices, that they might come and anoint Him.” Mark 16:1

“Now on the first day of the week [Sunday morning], Miryam from Magdala went early, while it was still dark, to the tomb, and saw the stone taken away from the tomb.” John 20:1

“Entering into the tomb, they saw a young man sitting on the right side, dressed in a white robe, and they were amazed. The malach (angel) said to them, ‘Don’t be amazed. You seek Yeshua haNotzri, who has been crucified. He has risen. He is not here. Behold, the place where they laid Him! But go, tell His talmidim and Kefa, ‘He goes before you into the Galil. There you will see Him, as He said to you.’” Mark 16:5-7
